The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology (HKUST) received a \$20 million donation for the university's development from Dr Chow Yei Ching, GBS, Chairman of Chevalier International Holdings Limited. In appreciation of Dr Chow's generosity, the University has named the Learning Commons in the Library as "Chevalier Learning Commons". The naming ceremony was held at HKUST on 2 November.
